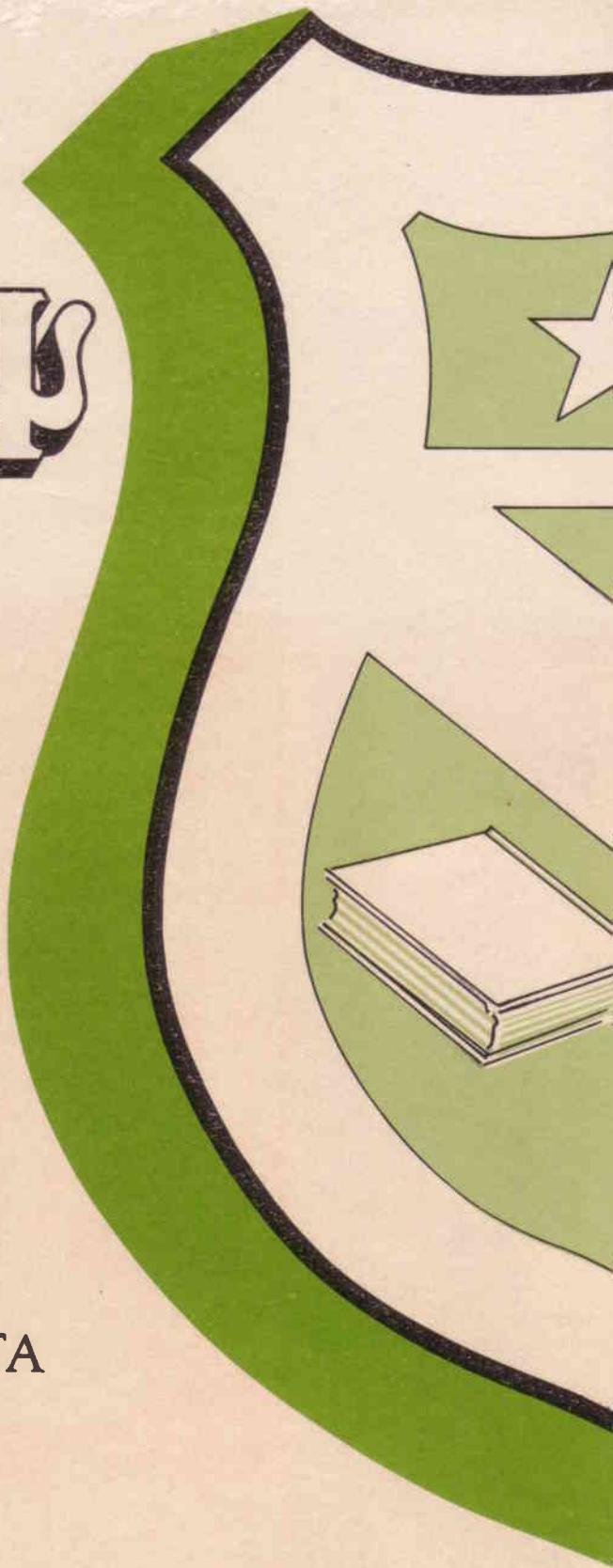

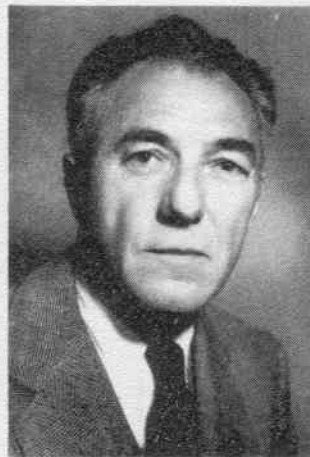
A National Fraternity

Out of the hardship of a typhoid epidemic in 1852 in western Pennsylvania and out of the idealism and initiative of our founders, William H. Letterman and Charles P. T. Moore, grew a national fraternity; the purpose of Phi Psi's founding was to establish a great national fraternity composed of outstanding college men of kindred spirit. Since its beginning Phi Kappa Psi has survived the disastrous years of the Civil War and the difficult years of growth and has become a top national fraternity composed of 63 chapters at major colleges throughout the nation. 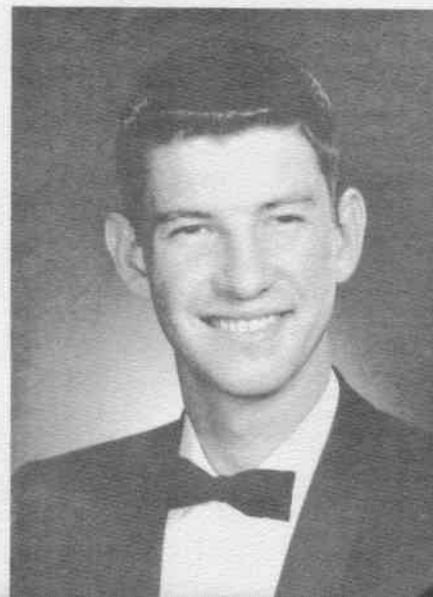
